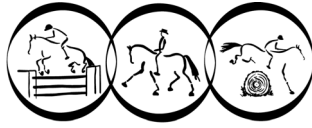
NEW EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR PICKS UP REINS AT THE HORSE PARK AT WOODSIDE

Woodside, California. Penny Howe Gallo, President of the Horse Park at Woodside's Board of Governors announced today that the Horse Park has hired Allan J. Behr as its new Executive Director. Founded in 1976, CTETA, Ltd. (the Combined Training Equestrian Team Alliance) operates The Horse Park at Woodside which opened in 1981. CTETA is a nonprofit organization dedicated to offering youth and adults opportunities for educational, competitive, and recreational opportunities in a wide variety of equestrian disciplines.
